

COUNCIL MEETING  
January 7, 2014

On Tuesday, January 7, 2014 the Mayor and Council of the City of Warrenton held their regular meeting at 7:00 p.m. in the Court Room at the Community Services Building.

Those present were Mayor George Ivey, Mayor Pro-tem Chris McCorkle, Councilmembers Craig Hunter, Steve Giddens, Brenda B. Johnson and Donnie Roland, City Attorney Glee Smith, City Administrator Mary Ann Moseley, and numerous citizens from the City of Warrenton.

Mayor Ivey welcomed those in attendance and Hancock County Probate Judge Marva L. Rice administered the Oath of Office to Mayor George Ivey and Councilmembers District 1 Post 1 Brenda B. Johnson and District 2 Post 1 Stephen K. Giddens.

Mayor Ivey led those present in Prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Mayor Ivey asked if there was a motion that the minutes from the last meeting be heard. Mayor Pro-tem McCorkle made a motion that Minutes as submitted be approved. Councilmember Johnson seconded the motion. Councilmember Hunter asked that a change be made to the minutes from the December 13, 2013 Public Hearing, he stated that he was at that meeting and his name had been omitted from the minutes. Mayor Ivey asked that this be tabled until he could learn more about this. Mayor Pro-tem McCorkle moved that the approval of December Council Meeting minutes be laid aside until they can be taken up at the next regular Council Meeting. Councilmember Hunter seconded the motion. There were no objections.

Karl Haywood came before the Mayor and Council to request that North Legion Drive be re-named Bobby W. Johnson Highway. Mayor Pro-tem McCorkle stated that he would like to take this as information and address at the February Meeting. Councilmember Johnson seconded this. There was no opposition.

Mayor Ivey recognized Mr. Don Pesek who stated that the City had just imposed a tax increase and he would like monthly financial statements so the Council and citizens could see how the City was spending the funds it was receiving. Mayor Pro-tem McCorkle asked that the Mayor and Council take this as a point of information. Mayor Ivey stated that he thought that people should be able to see the financial statements. Councilmember Hunter asked City Administrator Moseley if financial statements were available on request and she stated yes.

There was no other business to come before Council and Mayor Pro-tem McCorkle made a motion that the meeting adjourn. Councilmember Hunter seconded the motion. There were no objections and the meeting adjourned at 7:27 p.m.
